★ Smoking Crack Organization

On May 23, 2004 Linus Torvalds wrote:

[RFD] Explicitly documenting patch submission

"Some of you may have heard of this crazy company called SCO (aka "**Smoking Crack Organization**") who seem to have a hard time believing that open source works better than their five engineers do. They've apparently made a couple of outlandish claims about **where our source code comes from**, including claiming to own code that was clearly written by me over a decade ago."

★ Help document provenance of patches

"So, to avoid these kinds of issues **ten years from now**, I'm suggesting that we put in more of a process to **explicitly document** not only **where** a patch comes from (which we do actually already document pretty well in the changelogs), but **the path** it came through."

★ The originator and path

"Why the full path, and not just originator? "

In the chain we trust

- Originator posts patch
- **Community** provides review
- Originator posts v2 patch
- **Community** provides review
- Originator posts v60 patch
- Driver maintainer merges
- Driver maintainer send to Subsystem maintainer

Other maintainer sends to... Linus

★ The Developer Certificate or Origin

Originally posted as RFD, Request For Discussion, to the linux-kernel mailing list.

- As any good engineer, Linus put a version on it
- Titled, "Developer's Certificate of Origin 1.0" with three sections, (a), (b), (c).
- We already had documentation for submitting patches, so just amend it under:
Documentation/SubmittingPatches
- Now: "Developer's Certificate of Origin 1.1"
(d)

★ Summarizing the DCO

Summary of the DCO by Greg KH on the kernel-development slides:

- (a) I created this change; or
- (b) Based this on a previous work with a compatible license; or
- (c) Provided to me by (a), (b), or (c) and not modified
- (d) This contribution is public.

★ The Developer Certificate or Origin (a)

What the **Signed-off-by** tag means:

```
Developer's Certificate of Origin 1.1
```

By making a contribution to this project, I certify that:

(a) The contribution was created in whole or in part by me and I  
have the right to submit it under the open source license  
indicated in the file; or
```

★ Developer Certificate of Origin (b)

(b) The contribution is based upon previous work that, to the best of my knowledge, is covered under **an appropriate open source license** and I have the right under that license to submit that work with modifications, whether created in whole or in part by me, **under the same open source license** (unless I am permitted to submit under a different license), **as indicated in the file;** or

★ Developer Certificate or Origin (c)

(c) The contribution was **provided** directly to me by **some other person** who certified (a), (b) or (c) and I **have not** modified it.

★ Developer Certificate of Origin (d)

★ Proposal to make it standalone

- Proposal to make it standalone
- Alan Cox noted best not to modify the Linux kernel DCO
- Fontana notes Diane Peters might have authored it
 - CC-BY-SA-2.5-generic
 - GPLv2
 - Fontana: DCO not copyrightable, Public Domain
- W. Trevor King decided to try to package it as a standalone git tree, under github signed-off-by, kept all historical changes, took in the full **Documentation/SubmittingPatches**, made it project agnostic
- Assumed GPLv2
- Allows workaround for non-GPLv2 projects, even proprietary to refer to it under origin /contributing

★ Why we are here

If we are going to make this a standalone legal document and have projects refer to it, how do we do it, for the different versions.

- I threw out idea of combining DCO like language for copyleft-next to help expand sections 4 and 7
- Linux Foundation should be involved
- Get legal clarity on DCO license
- Evolve DCO through **dco-next** as copyleft with **copyleft-next**
- Create a **public** mailing list
- **Volunteer** DCO maintainer(s)
